Sara Heinämaa is Professor of Philosophy at the University of Jyväskylä, Finland. She specializes in phenomenology, existentialism, philosophy of mind and history of philosophy, and has published extensively in these fields, especially on normativity, values, emotions, embodiment, personhood, intersubjectivity and gender. She is an expert of Husserlian phenomenology but has also contributed broadly to our understanding of existential phenomenology and its methods, especially the philosophies of Levinas, Merleau-Ponty, Beauvoir and Sartre. Heinämaa is co-author of *Birth, Death, and Femininity* (2010) and author of *Toward a Phenomenology of Sexual Difference* (2003), and has co-edited several volumes, including *Contemporary Phenomenologies of Normativity Norms, Goals, Values* (2022), *Why Method Matters: Phenomenology as Critique* (2022), *Phenomenology and the Transcendental* (2014), and *Consciousness* (2007).

Sophie Loidolt is professor of philosophy and chair of practical philosophy at the Technical University of Darmstadt, Germany. She is also a recurrent visiting professor at Center for Subjectivity Research in Copenhagen. Most of her education took place at the University of Vienna, where she also worked as an assistant professor. Research stays brought her to the Husserl-Archives in Leuven, St. Denis University in Paris, and the New School of Social Research in New York. Her work centers on issues in the fields of phenomenology, political and legal philosophy, and ethics, as well as transcendental philosophy and philosophy of mind. Her award-winning book on the philosophy of Hannah Arendt develops a political phenomenology of plurality. Currently, she is working on a book on "public experiences."
